### Charge and Determination:

<b>Charge</b>	<b>Tribunal determination</b>
<p>1. The Respondent (Stacy Alogdellis) used offensive, insulting or abusive language and/or gestures towards or about a Match Official in breach of section 15.4(d), Schedule 3, Table B, Number 1 of the FNSW Grievance and Disciplinary Regulations (<b>Regulations</b>).</p>	<p>1. <u>Plea</u>: Guilty. <u>Finding</u>: Guilty</p> <p><u>Determination</u>: Five (5) fixtures.</p> <p><u>Reasons</u>: <i>The GPT found there was sufficient evidence to show that the Respondent complained to the AR about a decision taken by the referee and yelled "how the f..k was that a free kick". After asking the Respondent in a show of hand to stop and to sit down, the Respondent moved towards the AR and again yelled at the AR in a very loud, highly aggressive and abusive manner "hey, how the f..k was that a free kick". As a result the Respondent was removed / sent off from the Technical Area.</i></p> <p><i>The Respondent is suspended for five (5) Fixtures for the offence under Charge 1.</i></p> <p><i>The MGPT applied a discount of two (2) Fixtures due to the Respondent's early guilty plea.</i></p> <p><i>The Respondent is therefore suspended for three (3) Fixtures for the offence from accessing the Technical Area during play.</i></p>

**Costs:**

The Tribunal determined that the costs of the Tribunal, as determined by FNSW, be met by the Respondent.

Aggrieved parties to a determination of the FNSW General Purposes Tribunal may lodge an appeal to the FNSW Appeals Tribunal in accordance with sections 8.8 and 9.2 of the FNSW Grievance and Disciplinary Regulations. Any appeal must be submitted by completing the online Notice of Appeal form (Prescribed Form 12 – available on the FNSW website or by clicking [here](#)) and lodging the relevant Application Fee (\$750) within 7 working days of this determination being issued.
