Please find below the Football NSW Competition – Player, Coach, Technical Director and Club/Team Officials Registration Fees for the 2020 season.

All fees and charges listed below are GST inclusive. Unless stated otherwise, the participant is covered under the Football NSW Personal Accident Insurance Program and the NSW Government Sporting Injuries Insurance Scheme.

The fees listed below relate to the package of services provided by Football NSW Limited.

Important Information

Football NSW Capitation Fee, FFA National Registration Fee, and Insurance

The Football NSW Capitation Fee represents the financial contribution registered participants make to Football NSW to enable it to provide a wide range of programs, benefits and services to them and to the broader football community.

While Football NSW has not increased the Football NSW Capitation Fee since 2012, increased operating costs have necessitated a small increase for the 2020 season.

Further, due to an increase in insurance premiums, and to continue to better reflect the higher level of claims versus premiums collected for certain participants (relative to others), the Football NSW Board has also had to increase the insurance component of Football NSW Player Registration Fees for players participating in these competitions in the 2020 season. The insurance component is incorporated in the FNSW Capitation Fees set out above.

We advise that Football Federation Australia (FFA) has not increased the National Registration Fee (NRF) for the 2020 season and the NRF remains \$14.00 for Juniors and \$33.00 for Seniors).

Capped Player Registration Fees

Clubs participating in Football NSW Competitions are required to comply with the capped Player Registration Fees set by Football NSW for certain competition and age grades.

While the cap has not been increased in some time, Football NSW recognises that the costs associated with running NPL-level programs have increased over this period. In recognition of those cost increases, the Football NSW Board recently resolved to increase capped Player Registration Fees in some Competitions.
