Subject: Declaration of Leagues – 2022 Football NSW Competitions



Dear Club Representative,

We write with regard to the Declaration of Leagues for the 2022 Football NSW Competitions.

On 13 October 2021, the Football NSW Board considered the applications submitted for participation in the 2022 Football NSW Competitions.

In declaring the leagues, the Board upheld the eligibility requirements for competition applications, [as per our Memo dated Tuesday, 24 August 2021 \(Memo\)](#).

1. 2022 Football NSW Men's Competitions

We confirm that all 48 incumbent Men's Clubs applied for entry into the 2022 Competitions and all were successful. As such, no new applicants were considered.

2. 2022 Football NSW Boys' Youth League Competitions including Association Youth League

We confirm that all 48 incumbent Boys' Youth League Clubs applied for entry into the 2022 Competitions and all were successful. As such, no new applicants were considered.

In the case of the Association Youth League, all incumbent Clubs, with the exception of one Club that did not reapply, were successful in applying for the 2022 Competitions. No new applicants were received.

3. 2022 Football NSW Women's and Girls' Youth League Competitions

We confirm that all 23 incumbent Women's and Girls' Youth League Clubs applied for entry into the 2022 Competitions and all were successful.

All five incumbent Girls' Conference League Clubs applied to be part of the 2022 Competitions and have been added to the Football NSW Women's League One and Football NSW Girls' Youth League Two competitions as per our Memo. No new applicants were considered.

4. 2022 Football NSW Skill Acquisition Program (SAP)

The 2022 SAP structure remains as per the 2021 SAP structure. All 42 incumbent SAP Clubs applied for the 2022 program and all were successful. As such, no new applicants were considered.

5. 2022 Football NSW Girls' Skill Acquisition Program (Girls' SAP)

The 2022 Girls' SAP structure remains as per the 2021 Girls' SAP structure. 23 of the 24 incumbent Girls' SAP Clubs applied for the 2022 program and all 23 were successful. With one incumbent Club not applying for the 2022 program, a place become available for an eligible applicant and the Board resolved to grant a licence for the 2022 program to Central Coast Mariners FC. This Club was eligible to apply on the basis that it had participated in the 2021 NPL 2 NSW Women's Competition and given the absence of a Girls' SAP in the Club's geographic area, the Club were accepted. No other new applicants were considered.

6. 2022 Football NSW Competitions – Club Entry and Registration Fees

Unfortunately, we are still working with our insurance brokers to finalise insurance premiums for the 2022 season. Accordingly, we are not currently able to confirm the 2022 Football NSW Club Entry Fee or Football NSW Registration Fees for Players, Coaches, Technical Directors and other Club/Team Officials. We are currently working to have the 2022 fees confirmed by mid-November 2021, after which we will promptly communicate the fees to all stakeholders.

7. 2022 Football NSW Competitions – Capped Registration Fees

Clubs participating in Football NSW Competitions are required to comply with the capped Player Registration Fee (**PRF**) set by Football NSW for certain competitions and age grades:

Capped Player Registration Fee (GST Inclusive):

| Competition | Grade | *Maximum total amount a Club can charge a Player (inclusive of FA NRF and FNSW Capitation Fee) |

| Boys' Youth League One | U13's – U18's | **Up to \$2,850 |
| Boys' Youth League Two | U13's – U18's | **Up to \$2,850 |
| Boys' Youth League Three | U13's – U18's | **Up to \$2,850 |
| Association Youth League | U13's – U16's | ** Up to \$1,650 |
| Girls' Youth League One | U14's – U18's | **Up to \$2,250 |
| Girls' Youth League Two | U14's – U16's | **Up to \$2,250 |
| Skill Acquisition Program (SAP) | U9's – U12's | **Up to \$1,500 |
| Full Time Girls' Skill Acquisition Program (Girls' SAP) | U10's – U13's | **Up to \$1,500 |
| Part Time Girls' Skill Acquisition Program (Girls' SAP) | U10's – U13's | **Up to \$750 |

**FA National Registration Fee and FNSW Capitation Fee are still to be determined.
**This is the maximum amount a Club may charge a Player to participate in the relevant program.*
