The Respondent has made a detrimental public comment (including Media and Social Media), including but not limited to, comments that: (ii) denigrate or criticise another Member, whether in relation to incidents that have occurred in a Match/Fixture or otherwise in breach of section 16.4(d), Schedule 3, Table C, Offence Code 31-01 of the FNSW Grievance and Disciplinary Regulations (Regulations).	1. Plea: Guilty. Finding: Guilty Determination: Serve an eight (8) Fixture suspension (four (4) Fixtures to be suspended)

Serving of Suspension:

NB. The Respondent is to serve the suspension as a Player and in accordance with section 15.6 of the Regulations, in particular, sub-sections 15.6(h) and (j) which provide that, on the day of a Fixture, the Respondent must not:

- a. enter the field of play (or court), its surrounds, the technical area, players race, dressing rooms or any other place within a stadium, venue, ground or Centre where players and/or officials are likely to assemble to prepare for a match;
- b. be seated in an area in a stadium, venue, ground or Centre normally reserved for players and/or officials;
- c. have any contact with the Host Broadcaster or any other media where the purpose of such contact is for it to be electronically broadcast to the public, including (but not limited to) participating in any post-match press conference and participating in television or radio interviews; and
- d. in the case of a coach, must not engage or attempt to engage a third party to relay coaching instructions.

If the Participant commits a Misconduct offence, an offence towards or against a Match Official or an offence similar to the current offence (ie, social media breach) during the 2018 season (including the Championship, if applicable) then, in addition to any sanction imposed in respect of the fresh offence, the suspended part of the sanction will be activated and the Participant will be required to serve a further four (4) Fixture suspension. If the Participant commits a Red Card Offence, the suspended part of the sanction will not be triggered, unless the Red Card Offence relates to an offence committed against a Match Official.
