This document outlines the importance of ensuring alignment in the Australian football pyramid, which is connected through optimised and consistent competition structures, as well as establishing, evolving and growing a modern domestic transfer system (DTS).

The domestic transfer system includes a series of measures which are designed to grow the Australian football economy, reward and protect Clubs investing in player development, incentivise more Clubs to train and develop higher quality players, increase the length of contracts for young players, reduce unnecessary restrictions on the market, and comply with FIFA regulations.

In line with these principles, FA presents the National Premier Leagues (*NPL*) Player Roster Principles (*PRPs*). These principles include the below objectives, which align with the domestic transfer system initiatives:

- Provide greater opportunities to Australian players
- Ensure a focus on youth development
- Incentivise and reward Clubs that develop players
- Simplify the roster management system for the NPL
- Establish consistent roster principles at multiple levels of the football pyramid, with specific numbers and elements to be adapted for the level of competition

## **GENERAL DEFINITIONS**

The general definitions are provided for ease of reference.

The following discussion points and examples are intended to provide Member Federations and NPL Clubs with further clarity with respect to each 2026 NPL PRP.

## **AUSTRALIAN PLAYER**

An Australian Player is any player who is:

- (a) A citizen of Australia;
- (b) A permanent resident of Australia (where Permanent Resident means a person residing in Australia on a "permanent" visa class issued by the Australian Government, evidenced by either the person's Visa Grant Notice or as a listed entitlement on the person's online Visa Entitlement Verification); or
- (c) The holder of a refugee visa, humanitarian visa or protection visa issued by the Australian government. For further details, visit <a href="https://www.homeaffairs.gov.au/">https://www.homeaffairs.gov.au/</a>.

## **DOMESTIC TRAINING COMPENSATION**

Domestic training compensation takes into account the Australian structure of Member Federations and National Leagues as well as the need to compensate Clubs that invest in the training and education of young Players. Domestic training compensation is due when a player registers as a professional for the first time or a professional is transferred between clubs and signs a subsequent professional player contract until the end of the season of his 23<sup>rd</sup> birthday.

The current domestic training compensation system is outlined in article 14 of the National Registration, Status and Transfer Regulations (NRSTRs).

#### **FIRST TEAM**

First Team means the NPL Club's senior team participating in the NPL fixture.

## **FIRST TEAM PLAYER ROSTER**

First Team Player Roster means the roster of Players for an NPL Club's First Team maintained in accordance with the PRPs and in line with NPL competition regulations issued by the applicable Member Federation.

## **HOMEGROWN PLAYER**

A Player, who between the ages of 12 - 21, was registered for a period of three (3) entire seasons or 36 months in total (noting such periods are aggregate and not required to be continuous) with their NPL Club.

#### LOAN

Loan means the temporary transfer of a Player's registration from the Parent Club to the Loan Club, effected in accordance with the NRSTRs.

## **LOAN CLUB**

Loan Club means the Club to which the registration of a Player subject to a Loan is, will be, or has been temporarily transferred from a Parent Club for the term of a Loan.

## **MATCH DAY TEAM SHEET**

Match Day Team Sheet means the list of minimum sixteen (16) and up to eighteen (18) players from the First Team Player Roster who will participate in a specific NPL fixture as a starter or as a potential substitute.

## **NATIONAL PREMIER LEAGUE (NPL)**

National Premier League or NPL means the top tier men's club competition staged in each Member Federation in Australia.

## **NPL CLUB AGE-ELIGIBLE TEAMS**

NPL Club Age-Eligible Teams are the teams that sit below the NPL Club First Team, including the reserve team, as determined by each Member Federation. For clarity:

- where NPL Competitions commence from Under 12s, these include Under 12s through to Under 20/23
- where NPL Competitions commence from Under 13s, these include Under 13s through to Under 20/23
- where NPL Competitions commence from Under 14s, these include Under 14s through to Under 20/23

## **NPL CLUB**

NPL Club means any entity admitted by a Member Federation to field a team in the NPL as per the conditions stipulated in the applicable Member Federation's Club Participation Agreement and in compliance with FA's National Club Licensing Regulations.

## **PARENT CLUB**

Parent Club means the Club from which the registration of a Player subject to a Loan is, will be, or has been temporarily transferred to a Loan Club for the term of a Loan.

## **PROFESSIONAL**

Professional means a Player who has a written contract with a Club, under which they are paid more than the expenses they effectively incur to play football for that Club. All Professionals on the First Team Player Roster must have a written contract and comply with the NRSTRs.

## **PROFESSIONAL PLAYER CONTRACT**

Professional Player Contract means the legally binding document (NRR Prescribed Form 05 – Professional Player Contract) between two parties, being the Player & NPL Club, that defines and governs their rights and obligations, in accordance with the NRSTRs.

## **PLAYER LOAN**

Player Loan means the temporary transfer of a Player's registration from that Player's Parent Club to the Player's Loan Club, effected in accordance with the NRSTRs.

## **PLAYER ROSTER PRINCIPLES**

Player Roster Principles or PRPs means the system of roster requirements set out in this document for the First Team Player Roster of an NPL Club.

## **VISA PLAYER**

A Visa Player is any Player who is not an Australian Player.

## **AFC/OFC VISA PLAYER**

An Asian Football Confederation (AFC) / Oceania Football Confederation (OFC) Visa Player is any player who is not an Australian Player and who holds a citizenship from an AFC or OFC Member Association nation. Annexures 1 and 2 outline the list of AFC and OFC Member Association nations, respectively.

## **NPL FIRST TEAM PLAYER ROSTER PRINCIPLES - ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

Additional information for each player roster category and principle outlined in the above table, as well as a few related domestic transfer system initiatives, is included below.

## FIRST TEAM PLAYER ROSTER MINIMUM AND MAXIMUM

At all times during an NPL season, an NPL Club must include a minimum of 20 Players on its First Team Player Roster and may include a maximum of 23 Players on its First Team Player Roster.

All Players must be registered to the appropriate age-category (where applicable). Any Player who, during the 2026 NPL season exceeds the age-limit for the oldest NPL Age-Eligible Team at an NPL Club (e.g. a 24-year-old in an U23 competition), must be included on his NPL Club's First Team Player Roster.

All NRR Prescribed Form 05 – Professional Player Contracted Players must be listed on to NPL Club's First Team Roster and registered through the <u>Domestic Transfer Matching System (DTMS)</u> as necessary.

All NPL Club First Team Player Rosters must have a minimum of two (2) Australian Goalkeepers listed.

## **U23 AND U20 YOUTH PLAYERS**

FA is committed to promoting a greater focus on the importance of youth development in an increasingly competitive global market.

As a result, one of the key PRPs in 2026 is the requirement for NPL Clubs to list a minimum of three (3) U23 Youth Players on their First Team Matchday Team Sheet of up to eighteen (18) players, of which one (1) must be U20 Youth Player, with the aim of increasing match minutes for youth players.

Please refer to the table below which categorises Youth Player years of birth for the 2026 NPL season

#### **AUSTRALIAN PLAYER**

An Australian Player is any Player who is:

- (a) a citizen of Australia;
- (b) a Permanent Resident of Australia (where Permanent Resident means a person residing in Australia on a "permanent" visa class issued by the Australian Government, evidenced by either the person's Visa Grant Notice or as a listed entitlement on the person's online Visa Entitlement Verification); or
- (c) the holder of a refugee visa, humanitarian visa or protection visa issued by the Australian government. For further details see: <a href="https://www.homeaffairs.gov.au/">https://www.homeaffairs.gov.au/</a>.

#### **VISA PLAYER**

A Visa Player is any Player who is not an Australian Player.

Member Federations and NPL Clubs are encouraged to refer to the following website for further information regarding visas: <a href="https://www.homeaffairs.gov.au/">https://www.homeaffairs.gov.au/</a>.

For the purposes of the PRPs, a New Zealand Citizen is classified as a Visa Player unless he satisfies the definition of an Australian Player. Please refer to the Department of Home Affairs for further clarification regarding the visa status of New Zealand Citizens in Australia: <a href="https://www.homeaffairs.gov.au/">https://www.homeaffairs.gov.au/</a>.

## **HOMEGROWN PLAYER**

The Homegrown Player category is an FA initiative to encourage more players on the NPL First Team Player Roster to be developed within the NPL Club from an earlier age, with the intention of promoting investment into club-based talent between the ages of U12 to U21. In 2026, all NPL Clubs must have a minimum of three (3) Homegrown Players on their NPL First Team Player Roster.

For clarity, a Player does not need to be registered in continuous seasons in a NPL Club's Age-Eligible Teams to be considered as Homegrown Player.

**Example:** A Player is required to be registered to an NPL Club for a total of three (3) seasons or 36 months. For the avoidance of doubt, this may be for that NPL Club's U12 and U16 and U20 teams, and the Player could have been registered with another Club for his U13, U14 & U18 seasons.

#### **LOANED PLAYER**

In line with FIFA and FA loan provisions, NPL Clubs must adhere to a limit on the total number of domestic and international loans, as outlined below:

Domestic Loans: Six (6) players loaned out and six players loaned in.

International Loans: Six (6) players loaned out and six players loaned in.

Additionally, a maximum of three (3) players may be loaned out to the same club and a maximum of three (3) players may be loaned in from the same club.

**Example:** The below table provides an example using South Melbourne FC as the Parent Club. Two of the requested loans have been denied due to the regulations as outlined.

For the avoidance of doubt, for both international and domestic loans, the loan of a player is exempt from the total loan limits if the professional is a club-trained player with the Parent Club, as defined in the NRSTRs, and the loan occurs before the end of the season in which the player turns 21.
