SECTION 1: HAHN AUSTRALIA CUP ORGANISATION & ADMISSION

1. SCOPE AND APPLICATION

- a) All Clubs participating in the Hahn Australia Cup are bound by the Hahn Australia Cup Competition Regulations as promulgated by Football Australia from time to time.
- b) These Supplementary Competition Regulations (Regulations) shall apply to all Hahn Australia Cup Preliminary Round matches administered by FNSW and may be amended by FNSW at any time.
- c) Where these regulations are silent on any particular aspect, then all Clubs, affiliated bodies and organisations shall first have regard to the Constitution, By-Laws, FA Rules and Regulations and where applicable rules and regulations of the Asian Football Confederation (AFC) and FIFA
- d) Terms defined in the Hahn Australia Cup Competition Regulations and Football NSW (FNSW) Rules of Competition shall have the same meaning in these Regulations unless otherwise stated.

2. CONTROL OF COMPETITIONS

- a) The administrative control and conduct of the Hahn Australia Cup Preliminary Rounds by FNSW is vested in the Executive subject to any resolution by the Board to the contrary in accordance with Football Australia's Competition Regulations.

3. CONSEQUENCES FOR BREACH

- a) Any breach of these Regulations or failure to comply with any direction therein may result in a fine issued by FNSW or other sanction pursuant to the FNSW Grievance and Disciplinary Regulations.

4. OUTSTANDING DEBTS

- a) Treatment of outstanding debts will be as per the FNSW By-laws.
- b) For the avoidance of doubt, failure to comply with outstanding debts in accordance with the FNSW By- Laws may result in ineligibility to participate in Hahn Australia Cup Matches or forfeiture of completed Hahn Australia Cup Matches.
- c) This article applies to all Hahn Australia Cup Matches conducted by FNSW.

5. SPECIAL CONSIDERATION

- a) The Executive will have the power to consider individual circumstances outside the prescribed limits of the Regulations should it be clear those special considerations are in the interests of the game.
- b) The decision by the Executive to review and consider individual circumstances under this section is not subject to appeal or review.

6. DISCIPLINARY SANCTIONS AND PROCEEDINGS

- a) All Clubs, Players, Team Officials, Match Officials, spectators or any person participating in any manner at a Hahn Australia Cup Match during the Preliminary Rounds, or any associated event, will submit exclusively to the jurisdiction of the Grievance and Disciplinary Regulations and the Hahn Australia Cup Competition Regulations as applicable.

- b) The Disciplinary Committee will be convened by the Competitions Manager in accordance with the FNSW Grievance and Disciplinary Regulations.

7. UNFORESEEABLE CIRCUMSTANCE

- a) Nothing in these Regulations will prevent the Board from approving a course of action to meet unforeseeable circumstances not covered by the Regulations.

8. CUP FORMAT AND INFORMATION

- a) National Premier League (NPL), Football NSW League Men's One and Football NSW League Men's Two Clubs are required to register and participate in the Hahn Australia Cup Preliminary Rounds.
- b) The Hahn Australia Cup Preliminary Rounds will follow a gradual Hahn Australia Cup at the following stages:
- I. Association Clubs will enter the Hahn Australia Cup in Round 2; and
 - II. All Clubs in Football NSW League Men's One and Football NSW League Men's Two will enter the Hahn Australia Cup in Round 3; and
 - III. All Clubs in NPL Men's will enter the Hahn Australia Cup in Round 4.
- c) FNSW may amend the seeding of any Club within the draw as it deems necessary.
- d) All Round winners will proceed to the next Round.
- e) All Round draws will be random with no separation of seeds within each round.
- f) Where required, a bye round will fill any vacant slots in the draw process.
- g) FNSW may alter fixture kickoff times and dates as it deems necessary.
- h) The competition progression of the Hahn Australia Cup Preliminary Rounds for FNSW will be as follows:

Round 2	All Clubs outlined in Section 1 art. 8 b) i	All winners progress to Round 3
Round 3	All Clubs outlined in Section 1 art. 8 b) ii and winning teams from Round 2	All winners progress to Round 4
Round 4	All Clubs outlined in Section 1 art. 8 b) ii and winning teams from Round 3	All winners progress to Round 5
Round 5	All winning Clubs from Round 4 matches	All winners progress through to Round 6
Round 6	All winning Clubs from Round 5 matches	All winners progress through to Round 7
Round 7	All winning Clubs from Round 6 matches	All winners progress through to the Round of 32 (Final Rounds)

SECTION 2: TECHNICAL REGULATIONS

1. MATCHES PLAYED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAWS OF THE GAME

- a) All Fixtures will be played in compliance with the Hahn Australia Cup Competition Regulations and these Regulations in force at the time and in accordance with Football Australia and FNSW By-Laws, regulations, codes and directives, and under the FIFA laws of the game.

2. MATCH BALLS

- a) The Home Club shall provide the Match Official with three (3) match balls (size 5) no later than 30 minutes prior to the start of the Hahn Australia Cup Match.
- b) Only licensed balls approved by FNSW may be used as match balls for Hahn Australia Cup Matches and warming up.
- c) Where directed by Football Australia or FNSW, Clubs must use the Official Hahn Australia Cup Match Ball.
- d) Failure to supply match balls will result in a fine of \$100 per match they are not supplied.

3. DURATION OF MATCH

- a) Each Hahn Australia Cup Match must consist of two (2) equal halves of forty-five (45) minutes to total a "full" regular period Hahn Australia Cup Match time of ninety (90) minutes, excluding any additional time played as determined by the Referee.
- b) The half-time break for each Hahn Australia Cup Match will be fifteen (15) minutes.

4. EXTRA TIME AND PENALTIES

- a) If at the conclusion of the regular period in any Hahn Australia Cup Match (including additional time), the scores between the two (2) Clubs are tied, then extra time of two (2) equal periods of fifteen (15) minutes will be played. The conditions of Law 10 of the FIFA Laws of the Game will apply.

5. SUBSTITUTION RULES

- a) For Preliminary Round Matches, Each team will be permitted to use a maximum of five (5) substitutes:
 - I. Each Team will be permitted to use a maximum of five (5) substitutes:
 - 18 Players will be permitted on the digital team sheet, the 18th Player must be a substitute goalkeeper
 - If a Team does not have a substitute goalkeeper, that Team will be capped at 17 Players on the digital team sheet
 - II. To reduce disruption to the match, each team will have a maximum of three (3) opportunities to make substitutions during the match; substitutions may also be made at half time (do not count as one (1) of the three (3));
 - III. If both teams make a substitution at the same time, this will count as one (1) of the three (3) opportunities for each team;
 - IV. Unused substitutions and opportunities are carried forward into extra time

- V. One (1) additional substitute may be used and each team will have one (1) additional substitution opportunity during Extra Time of a match up until the conclusion of Extra Time (whether or not the team has already used the full number of substitutes or substitution opportunities in normal time), substitutions may also be made before the start of Extra Time and at half-time in Extra Time.
- b) Once a Player is substituted, they cannot return to the Field of Play to participate in the Match
- c) A substitution can be made upon a Match Official being notified. A substitute Player must only enter the field of play:
 - I. after the Player being replaced has left the field of play
 - II. after he receives a signal from the Referee; and
 - III. at the half-way line and during a stoppage in the Hahn Australia Cup Match.
- d) The Player leaving the field must leave the field at the nearest point on the boundary line, unless otherwise directed by the referee

6. LIGHTING

- a) For Preliminary Round Matches, Clubs that wish to play under lights must ensure that the facility lighting complies with the following:

Football NSW League One, Two V Football NSW League One, Two	100 Lux
Association v NPL	200 Lux
Football NSW League One, Two v NPL	200 Lux

- b) Portable lighting will not be permitted to bring the LUX rating up to 200
- c) Should a club use a council ground, they must provide confirmation what time the lights turn off
 - I. If a club cannot provide sufficient time the fixture will be reversed
- d) In the event of lighting failure:
 - I. The Home Club must immediately send a text message via the Football NSW after hours contact line, requesting a phone call for guidance, including whether the Match should be postponed;
 - II. The Home Club must use its best endeavours and take all reasonable steps to enable the lights to be turned on, including but limited to, contacting the hirer of the Stadium (venue) to seek support and assistance, and allowing access for a qualified person to investigate the light switch box; and

- III. If, notwithstanding the actions of the Home Club, there is insufficient lighting for the Match to be played, the Match will be Abandon.
- IV. If the Home Club have not followed the outlined process in the event of a lighting failure, the Home Club may forfeit the match.

7. COLOURS

- a) Where colours clash in the opinion of the referee, The Away team must change.
- b) The Away team is second team indicated in draw unless otherwise advised by FNSW.
- c) All teams must wear numbered strip with no duplication of numbers.
- d) All teams must have with them at each match a complete official and reserve playing strip.

8. ABANDONED MATCHES

- a) Matches may only be Abandoned by a decision of the Referee or Football NSW
- b) A Match may be Abandoned for any of, but not limited to, the following reasons:
 - i. One or both of the Clubs is not ready to commence the Match within 10 minutes of the scheduled kick-off time;
 - ii. A Club has its playing numbers reduced for any reason below the minimum FIFA requirement of seven Players;
 - iii. A disturbance involving Players, Club Officials and/or Spectators takes place;
 - iv. The lighting at the Stadium where the Match is being played fails, such that, in the opinion of the Referee, it is impossible or unsafe to continue to play;
 - v. The Referee or Football NSW determines that playing conditions have become unsafe or untenable due to adverse weather such as, but not limited to, excessive heat, humidity, lightning or rain; or
 - vi. The Referee, in consultation with other Match Officials, security staff and other personnel responsible for the safety of those attending the Match, determines that the conditions compromise participant safety. This includes the physical and mental safety of Players, Team Officials, Match Officials and/or Spectators.
- c) If a Referee considers it necessary to stop play due to adverse weather, the Referee will wait a reasonable length of time before deciding whether the Match should be Abandoned.
- d) If a Match is Abandoned by the Referee:
 - I. Both the Referee and the Home Club must notify Football NSW by close of business on the next working day that the Match has been Abandoned; and
 - II. The Home Club and the Away Club must submit a full report in writing to Football NSW within 48 hours of the abandonment.
- e) When a match has been Abandoned by the Referee, the Executive, in its absolute discretion, may investigate, or may refer to a Tribunal for investigation, the circumstances of the abandonment.

- f) If the Executive or a Tribunal (as the case may be) finds that:
- I. A Club, a Club Official, its Players or Spectators has or have caused, in whole or in part, the abandonment of a Match, that Club may forfeit the Match and/or may be subject to sanctions under the FNSW Grievance and Disciplinary Regulations.
 - II. Both Clubs have caused the abandonment, the Match will not be rescheduled and will be recorded as No Result, and the Clubs may be subject to sanctions under the FNSW Grievance and Disciplinary Regulations.
- g) g) If a Referee or Football NSW has Abandoned a Match due to adverse weather conditions or to a cause other than the conduct of either Club (including its Players, Officials and Spectators), when:
- I. 60 minutes of the regular Match duration has been played, and the scores are not level, the score at the time of the abandonment will be declared the final result
 - II. Either the scores are level or less than 60 minutes of the regular Match duration has been played (or both), the Match must be rescheduled by Football NSW as soon as possible.
- h) Football NSW will determine, in its absolute discretion:
- I. Whether a Match that is rescheduled pursuant to paragraph g) ii. will be replayed in full or will recommence at the time that had elapsed when the Match was Abandoned; and
 - II. The date, time and Stadium (venue) for the rescheduled match.
- i) If Football NSW determines that an Abandoned Match is to be recommenced, the following principles will apply
- I. Referee is the sole arbiter of elapsed time and no protest may be lodged in respect of the elapsed time as recorded by the Referee;
 - II. The score at the time when the Match was Abandoned will remain the score at the time when the Match recommences;
 - III. Both Clubs must ensure that the same Players are on the Field of Play and the same substitutes are available as when the Match was Abandoned unless a Player or Players has/have received a disciplinary suspension in the interim.
 - IV. If a Player has received a suspension in a Match that took place between the abandonment and the rescheduling of the Abandoned Match:
 - a. The Player will not be eligible to participate in the rescheduled Match;
 - b. The Player will not be able to count the rescheduled Match as a fixture served for the disciplinary suspension;
 - c. The Player's Club will not be permitted to replace the Player on the digital team sheet;
 - d. If the Player was on the Field of Play at the time of the abandonment, the Player may be replaced by a substitute listed on the digital team sheet, as long as their Club has available substitutions as per the Regulations; and
 - e. If the Player was a substitute at the time of the abandonment, the number of available substitutes will decrease, as the Player cannot be replaced.

- V. No additional substitutes may be added to the list of Players on the digital team sheet.
- VI. The Clubs can make no more than the number of substitutions to which they were still entitled when the Match was Abandoned.
- VII. Players sent off before the Match was Abandoned cannot be replaced.
- VIII. Football NSW will endeavour to appoint the same Match Officials to the rescheduled Match, however it may appoint replacements should any or all of the Match Officials be unavailable.
- IX. If a Club fails to participate in a rescheduled Match, it will forfeit the Match.

9. FORFEITS

- a) Should a Hahn Australia Cup Match not commence within 10 minutes of the start time in the match schedule or amended by FNSW, the Hahn Australia Cup Match will be forfeited by the team that has caused the delay to the start of the Hahn Australia Cup Match.
- b) Forfeits prior to the scheduled match day will result in a fine of \$500.
- c) Forfeits on the day of the scheduled match or without notice will result in a fine of \$500 per forfeited match plus relevant match official's fees.

10. MATCH SCHEDULE AND KICK-OFF TIMES

- a) Football NSW will communicate the official Match schedule for all Competitions
- b) Football NSW will determine the Stadiums (venues) of all Cup Matches
- c) Final match dates and kick-off times for all Matches will be determined by the Executive
- d) All Matches must be conducted on the scheduled day and commence at the stipulated kick-off time.
- e) Failure to do so may result in a fine of \$200
- f) Football NSW, in setting down kick-off times, may start Matches at 8:00 am for any daytime Fixture which may include Saturday, Sunday or any Public Holiday
- g) Football NSW may also schedule midweek evening Matches to accommodate Cup washed out or deferred Fixtures
- h) Any disputes between two (2) or more Clubs as to the arrangement of Fixtures will be referred to and decided by the Executive
- i) Notwithstanding any other Regulation on the same subject matter, the Executive reserves the right to alter or amend any Fixture after it has been nominated in the official Match schedule. The alterations could be to the date, Stadium, kick-off times or a combination of all providing the Clubs involved are given seven (7) days prior notice
- j) Changes to the official Match schedule for the Cup will only be considered in exceptional circumstances.
- k) Any application for a change of Stadium, Fixture and/or Match must be submitted to Football NSW, along with reasoning documentary proof of the "exceptional circumstance" validating the requirements for a Stadium change, Fixture and or Match change along with details of the rescheduled Stadium, Fixture and or Match, no later than seven (7) days prior to the scheduled Match

- l) Any application for a change to the official Match schedule within seven (7) days will only be considered by the Executive if in its absolute discretion it is satisfied that exceptional circumstances exist, including if a Stadium has become unavailable at no fault of the Club. Details of the rescheduled Stadium, Fixture and or Match, must be submitted at the time of the request for a change to the official Match schedule

11. CLUB OFFICIALS AND MATCH COORDINATORS

- a) All Clubs must supply three (3) jacketed Officials for all Matches, who must be 18 years of age or older and must have their names recorded on the digital team sheet.
- b) All jacketed Officials are to wear clothing that easily identifies them as Club Officials. (i.e. brightly coloured bibs).
- c) Clubs must ensure that individuals acting as jacketed Officials have read and understood the document [Jacketed Officials - Roles and Responsibilities](#) prior to taking up this role.
- d) Jacketed officials must have read and understood the document [Jacketed Officials - Roles and Responsibilities](#) prior to taking up this role.
- e) Failure by a Club to supply and identify the three (3) jacketed officials for each Match will result in a fine of \$100 per offence.
- f) Clubs and jacketed Officials who fail to comply with this Section 2 article 25 and/or the document [Jacketed Officials Roles and Responsibilities](#) may be dealt with in accordance with the FNSW Grievance and Disciplinary Regulations.

12. TECHNICAL AREA

- a) Only currently registered and eligible Players, Coaches and Team Officials are allowed in the technical area during Matches.
- b) All Team Officials in the technical area must be listed on the digital team sheet.
- c) All Players in the technical area must wear a bib that contrasts with the colours worn by Players of both Teams, Match Officials and the bibs of the opposing Team.
- d) All Team Officials in the technical area must wear clothing that contrasts with the kit of the Players and Match Officials on the pitch. Should their clothing clash they are required to wear a bib that does not clash with the colours of the Players and Match Officials.
- e) All substitutes in the technical area must remain seated unless moving to and from warm-up.
- f) Only one (1) Person at a time is authorised to convey tactical instructions from the technical area.
- g) For Hahn Australia Cup Preliminary Rounds the following is to apply:

A maximum of twelve (12) people are permitted in the technical area. These twelve (12) people are up to seven (7) substitute Players (inclusive of a goalkeeper) and five (5) registered Team Officials.

Seating will be supplied and placed in position by the Home Club in sufficient quantity to seat twelve (12) people from each Team.

13. INCLEMENT WEATHER AFFECTED FIXTURES

- a) In all instances, where rain or other weather conditions preceding a Fixture raise fair doubt as to the possibility of play taking place, the following rules are to apply, so that Players, Match Officials and the public can be given correct notice of intentions:
- b) Day/s prior to the scheduled match day:

- i. The Home Club coordinator or his/her nominee is to contact the relevant Stadium operator or his/her nominee the day prior to the scheduled match day to ascertain whether the ground will be fit for play. If the field has been closed, the Home Club coordinator is to immediately contact Football NSW and the Away Club coordinator to inform them.
- c) Day of the scheduled Match:
 - i. The Home Club coordinator or his/her nominee is to inspect the particular ground at 6:00am or the earliest possible time and decide whether play can take place. In the event that the Match is washed out article 28 (b) v. and vi. will apply.
 - ii. In the event no decision is made as per article 13 (b) i. The Home Club coordinator or his/her nominee, the Stadium operator or his/her nominee and the appointed Referee or his/her nominee, are to meet at the particular ground at 7:30am.
 - iii. The Referee or his/her nominee is to inspect the ground and decide whether play can take place:
 - At all; or
 - Providing no further rain falls.
 - iv. If, in accordance with article 13 b) (ii), the Referee decides that play can take place, he/she is also to decide whether all grades should be played.
 - v. The Home Club coordinator or his/her nominee is to communicate the Referee's decision by SMS to Football NSW immediately after the decision is made. The SMS must include the following details:
 - Competition Name
 - Date
 - Round Number
 - Time (s)
 - Stadium
 - Age Grades
 - Home Club and Away Club
 - vi. The Home Club coordinator or his/her nominee is to advise the Away Club coordinator immediately after the decision is made.
 - vii. Football NSW will communicate any field closures to the relevant Referee appointment officer, who will in turn inform the Match Officials.
 - viii. All Away Clubs and Match Officials should check with the Home Club before departing for the Stadium.
 - ix. In the case of Fixtures outside the Sydney Metropolitan area, the Home Club coordinator will be responsible for conveying the relevant information to Football NSW by 7:00am on match days. Referees officiating at Fixtures outside the Sydney Metropolitan area should check with the Football NSW Appointments Manager before departure from Sydney.
 - x. If washed out it must be played the following week on a synthetic surface
 - xi. Failure to adhere to any part of this article may result in a fine of \$100.

SECTION 3: ELIGIBILITY & DISCIPLINARY

1. PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

- a) Eligible Players:
 - I. An eligible Player is one who has completed an online registration through National Registration System, either direct with a FNSW or with a FNSW Member Association.
 - II. No player shall be permitted to play for more than one Club in the Hahn Australia Cup and can only represent the Club to which he is currently registered.
- b) Ineligible Players: An Ineligible Players is;
 - I. Unregistered Players.
 - II. Suspended Players.
 - III. Football NSW may decide, in its absolute discretion, whether a Suspension or part thereof may be served in an abandon, cancelled or forfeited Match and any such decision is final and not subject to any challenge or appeal.
 - IV. A Player that has been expelled from a Match on the day/s prior to an Hahn Australia Cup Match but after the regular Disciplinary Committee hearing date.
 - V. A Player that has been expelled from a Match on the same day as the Hahn Australia Cup Match but played early in the day.
 - VI. A Player that is deemed ineligible due to any article of these Regulations or pursuant to the Hahn Australia Cup Competition Regulations, these Regulations and/or FNSW Grievance and Disciplinary Regulations.
- c) Any Team that fields an ineligible Player will automatically lose that Hahn Australia Cup Match on forfeit and be fined \$250.
- d) Additionally, the Club, Team Official/s and / or Player may further sanctioned in accordance with the Hahn Australia Cup Competition Regulations and/or FNSW Grievance and Disciplinary Regulations.
- e) For clarity, it is the Clubs absolute responsibility to ensure that it fields eligible players in any Hahn Australia Cup Match

2. PLAYER AND TEAM REGISTRATIONS

- a) All teams must be registered online for their FNSW Association or FNSW Competition using the National Online Registration system, Play Football or in a system as approved by Football NSW
- b) For Clubs that participate in FNSW Associations or FNSW Competitions using the Dribl Competition Management system, Players will need to be allocated to the Hahn Australia Cup specific team, as provided for in the circulated guidelines for players to be deemed as registered for the Hahn Australia Cup and therefore eligible to participate.
- c) For FNSW Associations not using the Dribl Competition Management system, Players will need to be allocated to the Hahn Australia Cup specific team in Play Football or in a system as approved by Football NSW as provided in the circulated guidelines, to be deemed as registered for the Hahn Australia Cup and therefore eligible to participate.

3. PLAYER ROSTER

- a) All Clubs participating in the FNSW Hahn Australia Cup Preliminary Rounds must nominate a max of 40 players registered in Play Football or in a system as approved by Football NSW.
- b) Dribl Associations must nominate players via Dribl no less than 48 hours prior to the day scheduled for the Club's FNSW Hahn Australia Cup Match. Contained in the table are the maximum players permissible for registration in the Preliminary Rounds of the Australia Cup:
- c) Non Dribl associations must allocate players to FNSW Hahn Australia Cup team on Play Football or in an approved system by FNSW, no less than 48 hours prior to the day scheduled for the Club's FNSW Hahn Australia Cup Match. Contained in the table are the maximum players permissible for registration in the Preliminary Rounds of the Australia Cup:

Squad Total	Team Sheet
Maximum of 40 players	A maximum of eighteen (18) Players only may be listed on the team sheet, in accordance with section 4 art. 1 f)

- d) A Club may add players to the squad total, however a Club may not remove a player from the submitted squad total
- e) Each participating Club may not add to their Australia Cup Preliminary Round player roster from after 5:00 PM on the day immediately prior to the scheduled match. Unless determined by FA in its sole and absolute discretion.

4. DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

- a) Yellow Cards:
 - I. For the Preliminary Rounds, three (3) yellow cards equates to a one match suspension, being one (1) Hahn Australia Cup match Suspensions incurred due to the accumulation of Yellow Cards from the Preliminary Rounds will apply to the next Hahn Australia Cup Match and are to be served exclusively in the Hahn Australia Cup.
 - II. The accumulation of Player Yellow Cards during the Preliminary Rounds will be reset to zero (0) at the end of the Preliminary Rounds.
 - III. If a Club is eliminated from the Hahn Australia Cup and a player has received his third yellow card in the match that the Club was eliminated, the suspension will apply for the player's next Hahn Australia Cup Match in which the player competes in. Yellow Card suspensions are Hahn Australia Cup specific and are required to be served in the Australia Cup.
- b) Red Cards:
 - I. For the Preliminary Rounds, the Minimum Sanctions set out in the Table of Offences (as outlined in Schedule B of the Hahn Australia Cup Regulations) must be applied by FNSW to Red Card Offences and to Expulsion Offences.
 - II. Red Card suspensions incurred in a Hahn Australia Cup Match are to be served in the Club's next competitive fixture(s) Red Card suspensions incurred in a Local Competition fixture will apply to the next Match in which the suspended Player's club competes in, including the Hahn Australia Cup.

SECTION 4: TEAM SHEETS, RESULTS, MATCH OFFICIALS & VENUE ENTRY

1. DIGITAL TEAM SHEETS

- a) All digital team sheets for all Matches are to be completed online via Dribl
- b) Clubs are required to note the shirt number of each Player in Dribl. This information appears automatically next to the Player's name on the digital team sheet.
- c) The Home and Away Club must make their Player selection in Dribl and click on Submit team (at this point you can still make changes after submitting your team if need be) no later than thirty (30) minutes prior to the scheduled Fixture.
- d) No later than 15 minutes before kickoff – Click on Confirm team (no more changes can be made to match sheet. If you do need to make any last-minute change to the match sheet this must be communicated to the referee)
 - I. Should a listed starting Player be removed from the starting line-up, that Player may only be replaced by a Player listed as a substitute on the digital team sheet. The former starting Player may then be listed as a replacement. However, no other Player may be added to the digital team sheet to replace the former substitute Player.
 - II. Should a listed substitute Player be removed from the digital team sheet, the Team will not be permitted to name another Player in his/her place, and the number of available substitutes will be decreased by one (1)
- e) The numbers on the back of the Players' jerseys will correspond to the numbers on the digital team sheet handed to the Referee before the commencement of a Match. There must be no change of numbers from fifteen (15) minutes prior to or during a Match (this includes goalkeepers)
- f) A maximum of eighteen (18) Players only may be listed on the team sheet.
- g) At the completion of the Match, the Match Official is to enter the match data, which includes: the half time and full-time scores, cautions, send offs, substitutions and any other Match incident that is deemed worthy of inclusion in the post-Match reporting
- h) The Home Club and Away Club must, within thirty (30) minutes of the Match, validate the Match Official data to ensure all records are accurate. If a discrepancy is identified by either Club that cannot be resolved on the day of the Match, notification must be issued to Football NSW: matchreports@footballnsw.com.au within 24 hours of the Match taking place. Football NSW will review and adjudicate on the alleged discrepancy within a workable time frame.
- i) If a Player who is registered in accordance with the Regulations is not listed on the digital team sheet prior to the Match and then participates in the Match, the following shall apply:
 - I. The Club will be fined \$250 for the first breach
 - II. The Team will forfeit the Match for the second breach and be fined \$500
 - III. Any further breaches of this article will require the Club to show cause as to why the Team should not be expelled from the Competition, and the Team involved shall forfeit the Match in question and be fined \$500

2. RESULTS OF MATCHES

- a) For all Hahn Australia Cup Matches referees will enter the results into Dribl.

3. MATCH OFFICIAL APPOINTMENTS

- a) The appointment of all Match Officials will be made by FNSW, who may utilise such other persons as deemed necessary to assist in the carrying out of this responsibility.

4. REFEREE FEES

- a) The home club is responsible for paying the Match Official Fees in accordance with the Hahn Australia Cup Match Official Fees determined by FA, via Football NSW Payments Page – [click Here](#)
